APRNs: 15.2% SU problem and 4.0% SUD

OR/PACU/Outpatient surgery/<u>Anesthesia</u>: 7.9% SU problems; 7.1% SUD

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Moderate risk: 23.56% for Alcohol; 10.27% Tobacco; and 6.28% for Cannabis (Foli et al., 2023).


